- Is there an example to follow?
- Is there a command to obey? Is there an error to avoid?
- Is there an attitude to change? Is there a truth to believe?

#### PRAY

This can be as simple as asking God to help you use this scripture, or it may be a greater insight on what He may be revealing to you. Remember, prayer is a two-way conversation. Be sure to listen to what God has to say. Now, write it out.
